





AREA 3 MEETING: As Noeleen predicts in her President's Message our 12 members who attended the weekend meeting have been given much to think and talk about.

We worked up a particularly fine head of steam at the workshops that followed the address by the keynote speaker of the fourth session. This was the Hon.Justice Margaret McMurdo, President of the Queensland Court of Appeal and a member of the Zonta Club of Brisbane. The theme of her talk was Advance the Status of Women through Advocacy - or as Margaret explained, enlist the powerful to plead one's cause? Her talk covered such subjects as female genital mutilation, physical abuse against women, rape, et.al.

District 24 of Zonta International will take the first steps in advocacy on March 24 next, by joining in the Federal Government's Business Against Domestic Violence Initiative Breakfast. This will be launched at the Park Royal Hotel, Alice St., City. 7 am. to 9 am. A giant step forward. No doubt one will need to book early for this one.

Interesting guest of Area 3 at the week-end was Paula Duncan who chaired a workshop on physical abuse of women and children at Aboriginal settlements. Of Aboriginal descent, married to an Anglican clergyman Paula is writing a book on Aboriginal humour. Should do quite a lot to help the reconciliation process. Paula told us that in every Aboriginal community is to be found a strong woman to shoulder the awesome burden of her people's problems.

A Report: female genital mutilation

The Zonta International Project in Burkina Faso

Zonta has standing policies against Female Genital Circumcision (FGC). UNICEF policy regards FGC as violating the human rights of women and girls, causing health hazards and as an act of violence. FGC is a violation of girls' human rights as defined by both the UN Convention on the Rights of the Child and the UN Convention on the Elimination of All Forms of Discrimination Against Women.

Of the 14 provinces in Burkina Faso where a high prevalence of FGC has been revealed by a government survey, 7 will be particularly targeted for training and support by UNICEF. These provinces will be the focus of **Zonta International's** support. The activities of the project are:

- 1. increasing awareness of FGC and its consequences by community based consultations and training sessions in conjunction with government ministries dealing with education, health, water and sanitation, involving community leaders, traditional chiefs, women's associations, parent-teacher and student associations.
- 2. awareness-raising at village level involving resource persons and opinion leaders in work with parents, grandparents and youth. Will complement UNICEF efforts to keep girls in school longer, delaying marriage and improving access to health services.
- 3. targeting the women who perform the circumcisions, and those who support FGC with both legal and public relations campaigns.

The ZI pledge is for \$US350,000. The goal is to reduce the incidence of FGC in the seven provinces of Burkina Faso from 63.35% to 30% in the year 2000.

Odds and Ends


I was recommended to read the book *Desert flower* by Waris Dirie. Waris is a very beautiful Somali woman who ran away from her nomadic family when about to be given by her father in an arranged marriage to an elderly man. She eventually got to London, achieved international success as a fashion model, and more recently works with the UN Population Fund as an Ambassador for the Elimination of FGM. Waris had undergone infibulation at the age of five and describes this in its painful detail in her book. In Somalia it is estimated that 98% of women undergo FGM. Her book is well worth reading!!

I have also, through a mutual friend, made contact with a young Somali woman living here in Brisbane, Leila Abukar. Over the past eight years, Leila and her family have been refugees, with tragic losses of near relatives. Leila herself was at risk for campaigning against female genital mutilation in the refugee camp. In Brisbane, Leila has received support from Soroptomist International Brisbane South. She hopes to commence Social Studies at the University of Queensland this year. Leila and members of her family are living at Moorooka. Leila would be very happy to come and talk to the Club at one of our dinner meetings.

 Brisbane North is the second oldest Club in Area 3, Brisbane being seven years older, and there are 11 other Clubs younger than us in the Area.

Brisbane North is the tenth oldest Club in District 24, the older Clubs being Sydney (1966),
 Canberra (1969), Brisbane (1971), Sydney North (1972), Warringah (1975), Armidale (1976),
 Tamworth (1977), Wollongong (Jan. 1978), Toowoomba (Jan. 1978), and there are 58 other Clubs younger than us in the District.

Brisbane North was the 852nd Zonta Club formed in the world (I am assuming here that the numbers 24-03-0852 indicate our District, Area, and sequence internationally.) Coff's Harbour, 24.02.1588, seems to have the highest allocated international sequence number in our District.

■ The most recent Zontian tells us there are currently 1202 Clubs in 68 countries and geographical areas, with a total of 34,634 Zontians. (There will, of course, over the decades of Zonta's existence, have been many Clubs which have closed down.)







To: All Clubs in District 24

Pursuant to Articles XVII or XIX of the Bylaws of Zonta International the following is provided for your consideration:

Motion 8:

"That the Zonta District 24 Board produce a strategic/management plan on the governance of the District for the next 5 years, based on the current district boundaries, such a plan to include the optional use of electronic technology (video conferencing, email links, web sites etc.)" From the Zonta Club of Southern Gold Coast Tweed Area (N.B. Apart from the time frame, this motion is identical to Motion 5)

Motion 9:

"That District 24 supports a motion to examine the current constitution and organisational structure of Zonta and to make recommendations which will enable Zonta to operate according to current corporate business practises to make Zonta viable in the new millennium."

From the Zonta Club of Sydney East Area

Rationale:

Zonta is facing declining membership. Its constitution actively discourages clubs working together to promote Zonta's objectives or achieve service activities. At a national level no equivalent to Zonta International exists voicing the "Zonta" view to government, the media and the public.

Other "competing" service and Status of Women organisations take a strategic view of the business of increasing their public profile and membership. They lobby government, market, have a national PR function and partner prestigious organisations to further promote their goals. They have a voice within Australia, which they use effectively.

A wealth of business and professional talent exists within Zonta's current membership in Australia which is not used to build strategies to attract, maintain and communicate with new members nationally. To compete for membership Zonta must develop a national strategic business and marketing plan.

Its communication processes are inadequate. The lack of a consistent, centralised contact point within Australia to handle enquiries loses us potential new members. Service and Status of Women activities at Club level are not consolidated and used to showcase the positive work done by Australian Zontians.

While Zonta has some high profile members in NSW, these contacts are not enlisted to raise awareness of Zonta's aims and achievements. Zonta's constitution actively prevents these high profile Zontians' commenting publicly on topics of keen interest to women throughout Australia and thereby raising Zonta's profile nationwide.

Motion 10:

"That Zonta International empower a working party to draft a proposal for an award to be created to recognise the contribution of outstanding Zontians. Such an award to recognise service and excellence and not financial contribution which is already recognised by the Foundation."

From the District 24, Area I meeting

Motion 11:

"That, consistent with the commitment expressed by the International Service Program ZISVAW, the Zontians of District 24 support the Governments' commitment in the area of Law Reform and extension of services to women and children who have been victims of any form of domestic violence and call on Governments to provide more funds in the area of prevention."

Motion 12:

"That Zonta District 24 calls on the Queensland State Government to consider female genital mutilation as an offence under the Queensland Criminal Code and, further, to pass by legal instrument, and implement, the recommendations of the Law Reform Commission on this matter."

The International Guest of Honour is Dr Astrid Heger of the LAC & USC Violence Intervention Program, California. She and our national Guest Speakers Dr Patricia Brennan AO, Pru Goward, Head of the Office for the Status of Women, and Senator Helen Coonan, Government Deputy Whip, will address the theme for the day. They are all distinguished in their particular field.

We invite you to be a part of this historic event in Australia.

DISTRICT CONFERENCE COUNTDOWN IS ON!



Have you met a Zontian who belongs to a Golden Z Club? and now your thinking ... What is the Difference between a


Z Club and a Golden Z Club?




There has not been as yet airfares nor accomodation costs available. I shall keep you posted.

Several of our club members also attended the National Launch of the "White Balloon Day" Luncheon in August, where the focus was "Women of Australia" and their role in the prevention of child abuse.

The Advocates for Survivors of Child Abuse (ASCA) have adopted the white balloon as symbolic of the issue of child sexual abuse following a meeting in Belgium in 1996 where there was a tremendous demonstration of public support for parents whose children were sexually abused. Dr. Patricia Brennan then gave and excellent and very moving address about child abuse.

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

The highlight of the past month has been the Zonta International District 24 Conference held at the University of Southern Queensland in Toowoomba. The theme was "Changing Gears - Challenging Years". Ten Members of our Club attended and all had a great time. The responsibility of our Club at the Conference was the Tellers Committee and I wish to thank my other Members of Committee, Thea Biesheuvel, Jennie Watt, and Barbara Young for their hard

work. We certainly have learnt all the intricacies of voting.

The weather was perfect and it was a very warm, friendly and happy atmosphere at the Conference.

The Opening Ceremony with the parade of flags from all different countries was stunning and we had an Address by Professor Susan Bambrick from the University of Southern Queensland. Heather Waldren, a former member of our club chaired the opening session.

The business sessions included voting on the motions which our Club had discussed at two previous dinner meetings. The Conference delegates rescinded the motion that District 24 should divide, so that the division of areas 1, 2, 8 & 9 had to go back to the Clubs to see what Clubs thought about the issue.

The keynote speaker on the first day of the Conference was Dr Peter Ellyard, Executive Director of Preferred Futures Pty Ltd and Chairman of the Universal Greening Group who spoke on Changing Gears - Challenging Years and talked about the differences between management and leadership. It was a very stimulating and thought provoking talk.

Some of the highlights included the Young Women in Public Affairs Presentation of the 1999 Award to Alexandra Graham and the Jane M Klausman Women in Business Award Presentation to the District 24 winner Natalie Parlett. Natalie was the nomination from Brisbane North. Both Alexandra and Natalie spoke very well and impressed the audience. Our future is in good hands.

There were sessions held over lunch for the Committee of

The feedback from these sessions was very useful

Our International President Val Sarah has sent a video message and a copy of her report will be given to all club members..

There were also sessions on Female Genital Mutilation in the Australian context, Directions for Strategies to Eliminate Violence Against Women in District 24 and Sessions on Literacy/International Year of Older Persons Project and also an Amelia Earhart Award update. Due to our Teller Committee's duties I was unable to be present at these sessions.

On Sunday there was a very moving Memorial Service which was organized by Kathy Floyd from the Southern Gold Coast /Tweed Area and it will remain in our memory as Zonta gold rose was placed in a vase for each of our Zonta members who had died during the biennium and then gold balloons were released into the sky in memory of relatives and friends who had died.

The Hon. Justice Margaret McMurdo spoke on Sunday on advancing the status of women through Advocacy and Ros Kinder, Area 5 Director talked about strategies for Advocacy at the Club level. Both these talks were very inspiring.

The Conference banquet was also a great success and one or two of our members who shall remain nameless almost danced the night away. One of the interesting facts we heard during the Conference was that Dorothea Mackellar of *I love a Sunburned Country* fame, was a Zontan.

Letter from Janet Montrose (after the usual greetings, etc., the e-mail reads:

enjoying my life here.... I left so hurriedly from Sydney that I didn't have the opportunity to have a last farewell meeting with the club. I'm teaching the oral component of the English course which means that I see about 1,000 students from Form 1 to form 7 every 8 days. The best thing about the job is that I have NO marking to do. Please not Kathy and other Heads of English! It's really fun as the Chinese teachers discourage any form of student participation in class and my role is the exact opposite.

Apart from the job, I have made quite a few new acquaintances ranging from a Canadian journalist (Chinese born) to a Cathay Pacific pilot. This is due to the fact that I am living in a holiday resort called the "Gold Coast"! Yes, it is a Chinese version of what one could see on the Gold Coast except the accommodation is in 28 storey buildings. My flat is on the 9th floor overlooking the swimming pool complex, tennis courts and gardens. I can lie on my bed and look out over the South China Sea - on a clear day! So far I've done a few tourist things, but am planning trips to Vietnam and Beijing. There are 90 days of holidays here. After the National day celebrations I'll write something about the political experience here.

Zonta International Violence Against Women

Jennie Watt represented our club at a District 24 ZISVAW Committee Meeting held on Saturday 21 August, 1999. The meeting was held to look at activities and initiatives we could implement at a Club Level and District Level and to increase awareness within our own clubs. About 20 Zontans attended, representing 16 clubs.

Outcomes:

- 1. In November there will be a series of functions in Brisbane and other South East Queensland Centres. The speaker will be Jim Hardman, former Manager Polaroid Corporate Employee Assistance Program in the United States and founder of work Place Violence Intervention and Strategies, a Massachusetts based consulting firm which specialises in awareness, education and advanced training in workplace violence prevention. Jim Hardman is a frequent lecturer and speaker on family violence and sexual assault. He is also a survivor of child abuse and founder of a battered women's shelter and a batterer's treatment program. He is a member of the Massachusetts Governor's Commission on domestic Violence and on the Massachusetts based Crime and Justice foundation. He has received numerous awards and achievements throughout his career, including the Greatest contribution to social work from the National Association of social Work, Massachusetts Chapter, and been interviewed on numerous television programs including Oprah Winfrey and Sixty Minute NBC Evening News, the Justice File and a personal meeting with President Clinton.
- 2. We are looking at an initiative whereby businesses can provide tax deductible funding to partnership initiatives to increase awareness and provide support for victims and perpetrators of domestic violence, in return for information, awareness and training.
- 3. Establish a database of people who are prepared to donate skills and time for things such as Preparation of Resumes, Job Planning, Budgeting, Financial Planning Advice etc.

Looking forward to hearing from our members on what we can do.

A trip to Iran

I recently visited Iran as an invited speaker at a scientific conference, (one of two females in a group of 22 invited speakers) and thought I would share the experience with the club. I accepted the invitation for several reasons. I was invited by an ex PhD student, Mehri, who has now set up her own laboratory at Tehran University. I was happy to have the opportunity to see her again. I am intrigued by the history of the area and I thought I would have time to see a little of this whilst visiting the country. I was also interested to see whether stories that we tend to have told to us by the media about treatment of women in that country were a bit of a 'beat up'.

I had no forewarning of customs and, although not very clever of me, I did not try to find out a little more before we went there, except to check with my ex-student on whether I would have to wear a scarf. After getting a fairly soft affirmative, I left under the impression that I could wear my choice of clothes with only the additional scarf – my first mistake. Most of the women on the flight were in very Western garb on the flight, but as the plane approached Tehran a metamorphosis took place. They now became clothed in big, dark, full-length coats and all had scarves tightly tied to cover their hair, (not a strand shows). We were warned over the intercom in the plane that strict dress regulations were the rule for females. I tied my scarf on and donned the only coat I had with me – a big woolen 'duffel' coat. In the heat of summer in Tehran, this was not a comfortable option. In all my stay I did not see one woman or indeed teenage girl without this full covering. The only benefit I could see, in a womanly sense, is that you could have a 'bad hair day' and your pyjamas on and no-one would know. Later that first day I too was taken to a local shop to buy a 'big coat'.

We were treated very well by people organising the conference, but were expected to give our pound of flesh. After an overnight flight from London, we were given breakfast then taken to the conference centre. I made an error in putting my hand out to shake the hand of an Iranian (male), to be told that he could not touch me. By 8.30 am I was being interviewed for television and being told to pull my scarf further over my hair as some hair was showing. Gary, my husband, traveled with me simply because he loves to travel and uses my international conferences as an excuse to see the world. Although his company was more than welcomed in Iran, people constantly thought he was the invited speaker and I was the dutiful wife (mind you this happens in many countries, including the USA)

Recently I attended a Public Address "A Space Odyssey! 141 days on Mir" at The University of Queensland by Australian-born NASA Astronaut Dr. Andy Thomas. Last year Dr. Thomas spent 141 days in the Russian Space Station, Mir, and spoke about his experiences in training as an Astronaut and then as a Cosmonaut with the Russian team.



He held the large audience at the University enthralled with his description of his life as an astronaut on the Mir Space Station.
