They are to be distributed to traditional birth attendants from outlying areas who are being trained, or have been recently trained, in their use. This is part of an overall health initiative with intensive programs to assist empowering women, and allowing them the opportunity to understand the importance of health before, during and after pregnancy. This is critical not only for the mother but also the infant(s). This has been amplified with the recent health issues worldwide, which has meant that awareness and assistance is substantially required.


