MEMBERS PROFILE SUSIE DUNN

I was born in Toowoomba QLD on July 20th 1958.I am the youngest of 4 and I have 2 sisters and a brother. Dad had a hatchery in town and later moved onto an egg production farm with 25.000 chooks. I have many fond memories of helping in the hatchery and working on the farm. Mum did the books and I remember her spending time preserving fruits, singing in choirs and the choral society and doing overseas charity work. They were both very involved with church work also. The family had great times on our annual 3 week holiday at North Burleigh Heads and we would all sit and wait to see who would spot Dad 1st coming over the hill in his old van as he would have to drive to the coast on his own in the 2nd week of the hols. Because of work commitments. We did the same things every year on those holidays but always loved every minute of it.

While working at Community Health I completed a Graduate Diploma in Women's Health and sometimes relieve in the position when the Nurse is on leave. In my 18 years at Community Health I have worked in several different positions as Parent Educator, in Clinics and doing home visiting. I currently work as a home visiting midwife visiting new parents and thoroughly enjoy it.

During my work and studies, we had 2 beautiful girls who are now beautiful young women, both in stable relationships with successful jobs. The eldest lives in Melbourne and our youngest on the Gold Coast. We feel very fortunate that they are happy, healthy and independent young women.

The girls grew up in 3 of our 4 homes all in the Coolangatta/Tweed area. We are now empty nesters after 33 years of marriage and living in Banora Point where we have been for almost 13 years.

In 2010 I traveled to Nepal for 3 weeks and during that time did a 12 day trek with 10 other women to the Annupurna Base Camp in the Himalayas. What an experience to see the awesome country and to live and eat like the locals. They are so happy with so little. They are certainly lovely people. It made me realize how lucky we are living in Aus. I would love to go back sometime to meet up with friends made.


