

I know that these self catering events are hard work and a big ask for Zontians who already have a busy work and family schedule. They are just more profitable.


I think we can all be pleased with a splendid response and a good result. Now to projects.

KAYE CLARK—PROFILE.

Born and educated in Tasmania.

My lineage (for many generations back) was from mining, engineering and market gardening.

Mum and Dad were both heavily involved with community service through Rotary and Inner Wheel. Mum was involved with charities including Red Cross for most of her adult life. I was married for nearly 25 years. My ex husband was a builder. We have three beautiful children; Danny, Chris and Sam (Samantha) who all live in Tasmania. I have two delightful surrogate grandkids.

Initially, I worked in a (vehicle) spare parts department. Later I began teaching First Aid for Red Cross, became their Superintendent of Training for Northern Tasmania then State Director of Training.

I began my architectural studies as a mature student followed by a Master of Education. In the middle of my studies, I worked in Indonesia on major building projects. I had casual lecturing in Architecture at the University of Tasmania, also private architectural work and occasional fulltime work with other Architects. Towards the end of a bad year in 2000, I applied for work on the mainland and subsequently spent a year in remote Central Australia working on a major aboriginal housing project in the Anangu Pitjantjatjara Lands. Then I obtained part time teaching on the Sunshine Coast, then architectural work in Brisbane.

After surgery and treatment for an early stages cancer, I saw the ad for a lecturer at CQU, applied for the job and was appointed.

I am a 'people person' first and foremost, and also a 'visual' person. My talents include creative and practical architectural design, documentation and contract administration (ie; superintending construction), various forms of art and writing. Oh, and of course I am a university lecturer as I obviously have an aptitude for passing on my knowledge to others. I am experienced in organizing people and tasks, also in addressing various crises.

Photography and art (life drawing, portraits, etching, drypoint, linocuts, woodcuts and other forms of printmaking). I love gardening whenever I have the time and the place.

With the examples set by both of my parents and some personal experience relevant to the women's causes that Zontians address, I could not have found a better match.

Central Queensland University Awards.

Zontians will be aware that our club has supported women studying at Central Queensland University since June 1985 when the first Encouragement Awards were offered in the Faculty of Science and the Faculty of Engineering. A third Encouragement Award was offered in June 1999 in the Faculty of Information Technology.

These three Encouragement Awards continued until February 2009 when due to the many changes in faculty structure at the university over time, it was decided to reassess the Awards to bring them into line with the current faculty structure, the change in courses and the increase in part time students.

After discussion with staff at the University, three Encouragement Awards will again be offered to women studying at the University. The Awards are as follows:

The Zonta Club of Rockhampton Inc - STEPS Award Prize: University Bookshop voucher to the value of \$500

Awarded to the graduating CQUniversity Rockhampton STEPS female student (over the age of 25 years) who achieves the highest GPA upon graduation and who will be entering into her 1st year of study in a Bachelor program in the following year. (Other eligibility and selection criteria also apply.)

The Zonta Club of Rockhampton Inc - Encouragement Award 1 Prize: \$500


Awarded to the female student who achieves the highest weighted GPA (minimum credit) in her best four first year core compulsory courses completed in the same year within the Bachelor of Paramedic Science.

The Zonta Club of Rockhampton Inc - Encouragement Award 2 Prize: \$500

Awarded to the female student who achieves the highest weighted GPA (minimum credit) in her best 24 credit points in the first year core compulsory courses completed in the same year within the Bachelor of Engineering or Bachelor of Engineering (Co-op).

The three Awards will be offered for the first time in 2012, based on study in the 2011 academic year.
