Past Event - Birthing Kit Assembly Day



Another successful event our birthing kit assembly day was held on 9 May and we packed 1000 kits in an hour!

Sincere thank you to:

- Sally for coordinating Birthing Kits this year. We know this involves much preparation to ensure the event runs as smoothly as it did!
- Scots/PGC College for allowing us the use of the dining room at their boarding facility in Locke Street.
- Zontians and community members, including students and teachers from Warwick State High School, Assumption College and Scots/PGC College. In all, 57 people attended, and 1000 kits were packed within an hour, and only another hour before all Zontians had packed the kits into boxes ready for delivery, tidied the area, and headed off.
- Zontians for providing morning tea. Again delicious food and requests for recipes!

The United Nations (W.H.O.) estimates that 385,000 women die annually in childbirth. Developing countries account for 99% of these deaths. For every woman who dies in childbirth, another 30 women incur injuries and infections – many of which are often painful, disabling, embarrassing and lifelong.

There are ways to help reduce these statistics, including:

- 1. Preventing unwanted pregnancies
- 2. Improving antenatal care
- 3. Improving capacity for dealing with obstetric complications
- 4. Providing clean birthing conditions

The Birthing Kit Foundation Australia (BKFA) is trying to reduce these horrific statistics through education programs and the supply of clean birthing kits. Approximately 140,000 birthing kits are assembled each year in Australia. The birthing kit addresses the 7 cleans needed for a safe delivery, with each kit containing a plastic sheet, soap, 2 gloves, sterile scalpel blade, 3 cords and 5 gauze squares.

The idea for the Birthing Kit Project originated with Dr Joy O'Hazy a member of the Zonta Club of the Adelaide Hills, who attended a presentation on how these small kits can save a life at the 5th World Health Conference in Beijing in 1995 – 4 years later this Zonta Club organised the first assembly day, making 100 kits which were sent to PNG. Since then Zonta clubs in Districts 22, 23 and 24 continue to fundraise and assemble birthing kits.

- WSHS uniform pool allowing female students access to the use of formal uniforms and the subsequent ability to attend school excursions and awards presentations
- · Self Harm identification and prevention training for adults and teachers in the Warwick area
- Annual Senior Girl's Scholarship supporting a young woman in continuing higher education (Yrs 11 – 12)
- Annual Young Women in Public Affairs award, club level
- A targeted program for young women to continue secondary education at the Southern Downs Flexible Learning Hub
- 1,000 birthing kits for improved delivery options to 3rd world mothers
- Annual ZONTA International donation with focus on domestic violence programs within Australia and across the world


